GAIT Professional Development Webinar on Managing the COVID-19 Impact and Self-Care (2021 Summer) - Initiated and coordinated an online professional development program to support those impacted by COVID-19 pandemic in the past year and discuss self-care strategies.

GAIT Professional Development Webinar Series: Managing the COVID-19 Impact in K-12 Settings (2020 Summer, 3 Webinars) - Initiated and coordinated an online professional development program to support K-12 teachers and school library media specialists in managing the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic to teaching and learning.

Stories from Home: Using and Integrating Technology in International Contexts (2015, 2016) - Initiated a new community outreach program where International Division members can share experiences of using and integrating technology in educational settings in their home countries.

Doctor Is In: Consultation on Teaching, Research, and Service in International Contexts (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018) - Initiated a one-stop consultation service for International Division members interested in researching international context and issues about job search, tenure, promotion of international faculty in American higher education institutions.

Who's Who in the International Division (2014, 2015, 2016) - Initiated a poster program to increase the visibility and presence of International Division members to the AECT community. The Division auctioned the posters to raise funds in support of its activities.

Magic Mondays Workshops (2010-2011) - Designed, developed, and implemented small group, hands-on workshops once a month (November-March) for the College of Education faculty. The workshops enhanced faculty knowledge and skills using emerging Webbased applications (*Comic Life, Moviemaker, Voice Thread, Blogger, and Google Applications*). The tools and applications supported the curriculum and student learning. Also, these workshops were made available to other faculty members outside of the college. The Faculty Development, Mentoring, and Retention Committee sponsored these professional development activities.

Research

Collaboration on Designing Global Learning Experiences (2020) - Connected two graduate classes at a distance (more than 3,000 miles and a 12-hour time difference) using various information and communication technologies. Students worked as virtual teams in designing, developing, and delivering learning experiences focusing on global learning skills. The project collected data about students' online experiences to plan future research activities.

Creativity, Critical Thinking, and Collaborative Learning among Young Learners Research Project (United States/Philippines, 2019) - Designed, developed, and implemented a research project focusing on expanding one's understanding of creative thinking and collaborative learning among young learners (5 years old) when presented with various tasks. The research project involved complex and straightforward functions in providing opportunities to observe young learners demonstrate creative thinking

and collaboration skills. The researcher believed that the study's findings contribute to an increased understanding of the development of creative thinking among young learners given the three identified and influencing factors: gender, grouping format, and type of task. The increased understanding of each factor's influences and the effect of the interactions of these factors on young learners' growth and development in and out of the classroom would benefit those who educate this population.

Technology Integration Practices in Panay Island, Philippines (Philippines, 2016-2017) - Designed, developed, and implemented a research project focusing on how a country's educational system changes and embraces the demands of the 21st century and global economy with a focus on context (national, regional, local, urban, rural, urban/rural), content (curriculum, educational technology), currency (teaching and learning models, frameworks) and community of practice (professional development, support infrastructure). Given this, investigated how students use and integrate technology into their daily activities. Data collection focused on curricular content and practices that demonstrate effective use and integration of technology by students, K-12 teachers, and higher education faculty as outlined by the Philippine Department of Education (DepEd) and the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) as national governing entities for education.

Concept Mapping in Undergraduate Science Courses (United States, 2015-2018) - Designed, developed, and implemented a research project focusing on concept mapping as a note-taking strategy. The faculty member implemented concept mapping as a note-taking strategy to quickly identify significant concepts within a given unit and connect meaningful ideas. Also, the inquiry wanted to see if implementing concept mapping as a note-taking strategy would help students retain and recall information throughout an entire semester. Data were collected from fall 2015 to 2018 in an undergraduate science course, Principles of Biology I lecture (BIOL 1107).

LMS Transition Research Project (United States, 2009-2010) - Designed, developed, and implemented a research project on faculty responses to changes in the learning management system (LMS) used to support online/hybrid course delivery in the middle of an academic year. The project surveyed education faculty on factors that enhance/impede a smooth LMS transition. The faculty member conducted focus group interviews as a follow-up to the survey that validated the initial themes and patterns. The project resulted in local and national presentations and publication in an edited book.

Atlanta to Manila Moodle Research Project (United States & Philippines, 2008-2009) - Designed, developed, and implemented a collaborative learning research project between undergraduate students enrolled in teacher education programs at two universities -- Centro Escolar University (Manila, Philippines) and the University of West Georgia (Georgia, USA) --- using Moodle, a server-based application. Students interacted with each other and discussed common topics related to teaching and learning in K-12 contexts. Also, they provided feedback on assignments related to their coursework. The project resulted in three international presentations and three publications.

Higher Education

Using Data to Explore a New Program Track for Trainers, Developers, and Designers (United States, 2017) - "Excellence in research and graduate/professional education" is a strategic imperative for Georgia's University System. The Department must recognize changing populations, enrollment management, program sustainability, and new curriculum development opportunities. The project promoted the collection and use of data to support program-based decision-making.

Immersive Undergraduate Research and Mentoring Experience (United States, 2014-2015) - Given the pursuit of "excellence in research and graduate/professional education" as a strategic imperative for the University System of Georgia, this project built a good foundation of research knowledge and skills, especially at the undergraduate level. The project promoted student engagement and retention.

Special Education Specialist Students Research Bootcamp (United States, 2014) - In collaboration with the Special Education faculty, the faculty provided support to her six (6) Educational Specialist (Ed.S.) degree students in completing their thesis using a Boot Camp format. This service project involved four full-day Saturdays from July to September 2014.

Faculty Studio for Teaching and Technology (United States, 2011-2012) - In collaboration with the current department chair, conceptualized a one-stop multimedia studio to support faculty work in designing and developing digital resources (audio, video) for online teaching. The faculty converted the room, Education Annex 123, into a teaching facility with support from eTuition funds.

R2D2 Faculty Development Project (United States, 2009-2010) - Developed a proposal for supporting faculty development through cross-disciplinary collaboration among faculty members. It proposed engaging two faculty members from two divergent disciplines in developing a faculty development event that describes and discusses discipline-specific tools, applications, or strategies using an R2D2 framework (Read-Demonstrate-Reflect-Do). After the presentation, the faculty members should identify similarities and differences in using or implementing these resources and practices in their disciplines. The proposal was presented to the Provost's office, and a positive response was received for possible implementation in the following academic year. Further, the proposal was presented at a regional faculty development conference and received a positive reaction for feasibility and value.
