PLUS INFORMATION MISMATCH POLICIES

- 1) The purpose of this form is to verify that a Parent PLUS applicant is an eligible Parent PLUS borrower (biological or adoptive parents only; a stepparent is eligible only if currently married to a biological parent). The financial aid office will utilize this form to ensure compliance.
- 2) Requested PLUS amounts may be denied or reduced due to reaching your financial aid budget or for any other reason in accordance with federal or institutional awarding policies.

- 4) Signatures must be hand-signed by the borrower and student. Digital signatures will not be accepted.
